Esperanto is a simple, expressive language for bridging the barriers that separate peoples and cultures. It's a shared second language that's relatively easy to learn and belongs to no one nation, ethnicity, or ideology. For over a century, millions of people have used Esperanto to travel and to learn about foreign cultures and literatures.



This course will teach the essential grammar and vocabulary necessary for basic communication. If you continue coming to Esperanto@UIUC meetings, in about a month you should be able to hold simple conversations with speakers from other countries, read books and magazines, understand radio programs, and even travel for free using the *Pasporta Servo*, a service for Esperanto-speaking tourists.

Students who want to learn more may be eligible for a scholarship to the University of California at San Diego (UCSD). In July, UCSD will be offering the *North American Summer Esperanto Institute*, an immersive series of courses that attract students from around the world.
